# **About the Report**

# Report Statement



This report represents the eighth Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) report issued by Sun Art Retail Group Limited (hereinafter referred to as "we", "Sun Art Retail" or "the Group"), disclosing key performance indicators across environmental, social and governance aspects during the reporting period from April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025.

## Preparation Basis



The report has been prepared in accordance with Appendix C1 *Corporate Governance Code* and Appendix C2 *Environmental, Social and Governance Reporting Code* under the *Listing Rules* of the Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the HKEX). The compilation process involved identifying and prioritizing key stakeholders and material ESG issues, determining reporting boundaries, collecting relevant materials and data, drafting the report content, and conducting comprehensive reviews to ensure completeness, materiality, authenticity and balanced representation.

The policies, statements, information and related data contained in this report are derived from Sun Art Retail and its consolidated subsidiaries during the 12-month reporting period.

The report's content primarily derives from the Group's statistical reports and official documentation. We confirm this report contains no false records or misleading statements, and assume full responsibility for its authenticity, accuracy and completeness. Data sources include public information, Sun Art Retail's internal statistical reports, third-party questionnaires and interviews. All economic data aligns with the scope of information presented in Sun Art Retail's 2024/2025 Annual Report.

# **From our Board**



Sun Art Retail has established a three-tiered collaborative governance system comprising "the Board of Directors – ESG Management Committee – ESG Working Group". Through organic coordination across all levels, the Group has deeply integrated the concept of sustainable development into its entire operational processes, continuously benchmarking against global best practices and standards in environmental, social, and governance (ESG). The Group actively responds to the national "Carbon Peaking and Carbon Neutrality" strategic goals and the global retail industry's green transformation trends.

As the central decision-making body for ESG governance, the Board of Directors assumes full responsibility for formulating and overseeing the implementation of the Group's ESG strategies. The ESG Management Committee dynamically tracks the execution of the strategy and periodically reports progress to the Board of Directors, establishing a two-way feedback mechanism between decision-making and implementation.

The Board of Directors strictly adheres to the Group's ESG management framework, convening dedicated meetings to systematically evaluate the effectiveness of ESG strategy implementation, comprehensively assess mitigation measures for identified risks and opportunities, and review goal attainment progress. During the reporting period, the Board of Directors received dedicated briefings on the progress of environmental targets, conducted in-depth reviews of the identification for climate change-related risks and opportunities, and granted final approval for the public release of this Report.

Regarding materiality assessment of ESG issues, we have identified 29 core ESG topics by synthesizing stakeholder expectations, capital market trends, operational realities, and industry best practices. By allocating resources differentially based on issue materiality, the Group has effectively advanced ESG initiatives. Simultaneously, the Group continues to strengthen closed-loop ESG risk management to maintain industry-leading progress in sustainable development.

Looking ahead, the Board of Directors will further deepen its ESG governance responsibilities, leveraging strategic resilience to safeguard the achievement of sustainable development goals. By enhancing governance efficacy to integrate multi-stakeholder efforts, the Board will drive Sun Art Retail toward sustainable development.

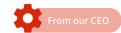

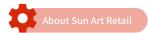

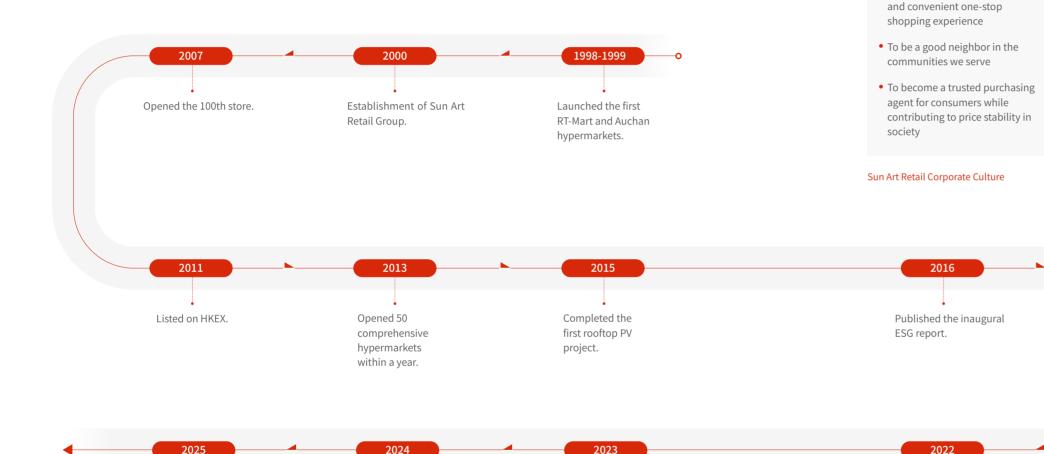

- Composed of designated representatives from all departments including division directors and regional managers, who serve as ESG leads.
- Under the guidance of the ESG Management Committee, the Working Group implements ESG strategies, policies and objectives across operations.

## Governance Framework

We consistently adhere to the highest standards of compliance, strictly following regulatory requirements including the *Company Law of the People's Republic of China*, the *Securities Law of the People's Republic of China*, the *Corporate Governance Code* for Listed Companies, and the HKEX *Listing Rules*. Our governance framework, anchored by the *Corporate Governance and Compliance Manual*, ensures full alignment with all regulatory expectations.

Our governance structure follows a "Three-Tier System" model, where the Board of Directors oversees three specialized committees, Audit, Remuneration, and Nomination, each operating with clearly defined responsibilities, full transparency, and dynamic evaluation mechanisms. Through ongoing self-assessment and continuous improvement, we have established an efficient governance cycle with well-defined accountability, consistently strengthening the resilience of Sun Art Retail's governance framework.

During the reporting period, we revised and optimized our corporate governance policies in response to updates in the *Company Law*, with these changes being approved by the Board and implemented Group-wide. The Sun Art Legal Academy conducted four training sessions on the *New Company Law and Corporate Governance Planning*, ensuring our employees remain fully informed of the latest legal and regulatory developments.

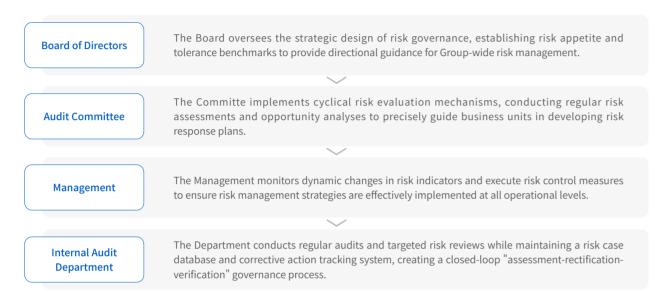
We embrace diversity in our Board structure by selecting directors who bring industry insights, professional expertise, and regional experience to create multidimensional decision-making perspectives. Our *Board Diversity Policy* clearly outlines the various factors, including gender, age, cultural and educational background, professional qualifications, skills, knowledge, and industry/regional experience, that the Nomination Committee must consider during director selection. Through our independent director evaluation system, we regularly assess both independence and performance effectiveness to ensure optimal strategic decision-making and oversight functions.

To strengthen investor relations, we have established multi-tiered communication channels including shareholder meetings and earnings briefings. We maintain transparent dialogue on critical matters such as audit compliance and related-party transactions while systematically enhancing ESG disclosures to safeguard investors' right to information and foster market recognition of our strategic value and sustainability philosophy.



# Risk Management

We integrate risk management as a core governance dimension through a Board-led four-tier risk prevention system that systematically strengthens internal controls. Adopting a lifecycle management approach, we conduct regular risk identification and stress testing while dynamically optimizing our risk assessment models. Our closed-loop management process includes continuous monitoring of control implementation effectiveness, creating robust risk defenses to ensure the Group's stable operations.



#### Sun Art Retail Risk Management Framework

In FY 2024/2025, our internal audit department conducted ongoing reviews of critical business operations and financial reportingrelated internal controls. In compliance with SOX requirements, we implemented management self-assessment procedures, testing nine core processes including group-level controls, with particular emphasis on improving the accuracy of capital expenditure recognition, an area historically prone to discrepancies in fixed asset accounting. Concurrently, we executed targeted audits in high-risk domains such as billing systems and B2B operations, identifying root causes of risks while facilitating cross-functional collaboration to enhance billing accuracy and operational risk management effectiveness for management decision-making.

#### **SOX Process Coverage**

Furthermore, we engage professional external audit teams on a regular basis to conduct independent risk and internal control assessments. During the FY 2024/2025, third-party auditors were appointed to evaluate our Group's internal control systems, with particular focus on the appropriateness of design and operational effectiveness of financial reporting-related controls. The external audits identified no material control deficiencies, and all recommended corrective actions have been fully implemented.

Throughout the reporting period, we established a comprehensive, real-time risk monitoring system by integrating legal entity master data with third-party risk surveillance platforms. The system incorporates 57 monitoring interfaces covering administrative penalties, business registration changes and other critical areas, enabling real-time risk tracking, proactive alerts, and regular multi-dimensional reporting. This advanced monitoring capability allows for precise identification of key risks and prevents potential risk escalation at the source.

We are dedicated to fostering an ethical corporate culture and upholding integrity as our core value. We strictly comply with relevant laws and regulations including Anti-Unfair Competition Law of the People's Republic of China and Anti-Money Laundering Law of the People's Republic of China across all operating regions. Our comprehensive internal policies, the Employee Handbook, Anti-Corruption Guidelines, Integrity Commitment Letter, and Gift Handling Regulations, integrate business ethics compliance with employee performance evaluations, position assessments, and promotions to prevent misconduct.

To strengthen our integrity and compliance framework, we have established a comprehensive gift management mechanism supported by internal policies such as the Integrity Gift Disposal Procedures. By developing a digital declaration portal through the DingTalk system, we have implemented a fully traceable online process covering gift declaration, approval, and disposal, making compliance management more transparent and efficient. During the reporting period, our compliance platform recorded 1,425 declarations, including 1,369 internal employee relationship disclosures, 28 position-related declarations, 15 other cases, and 13 gift declarations, while our integrity charity account received monetary gifts totaling RMB3,035.

We maintain a robust integrity management structure where the Internal Control Task Force and Integrity Department serve as primary enforcement bodies. These units collaborate with Operations and Loss Prevention teams through a tripartite investigation mechanism to examine employee misconduct cases. The dedicated Integrity Department improves internal policies and participates in mid-to-senior level case investigations, with all business ethics findings reported directly to the CEO.

• Internal employees, suppliers, external investors and other stakeholders may anonymously report misconduct in business operations through multiple channels including the "Integrity Reporting" portal on RT-Mart's official website, dedicated hotlines, postal mail, and the anti-corruption reporting system platform.



• The Internal Control Task Force handles complaint intake, categorizing reports by nature while encrypting sensitive information (such as whistleblower identities). The team tracks case progress weekly and compiles monthly summary reports for management review.



- Corruption cases involving store managers (or equivalent) and director-level (or above) personnel are investigated by the **Integrity Department**
- Cases below store manager and director levels are investigated jointly by the Internal Control Task Force, Headquarters Loss Prevention Team, and regional general managers



• Upon investigation completion, the Loss Prevention Team produces a final report requiring approval from the CEO, CHO, and Head of Internal Control (with CFO copied). All investigations conclude within three months maximum. Approved reports are archived in the corporate system and case tracking is formally closed.

Sun Art Retail Whistleblowing Process

We are fully committed to protecting whistleblowers through comprehensive confidentiality measures and security safeguards, strictly prohibiting any form of retaliation against reporting parties. Our investigators rigorously adhere to internal protocols including the Anti-Corruption Guidelines, implementing robust protections such as restricted system access and mandatory non-disclosure agreements to ensure complete information security and personal safety for whistleblowers.

#### **System Access Restrictions**

Access to the anti-corruption system requires authorization exclusively granted by the highest-level administrator, a single designated senior internal control compliance expert.

#### **Information Encryption**

All reported cases undergo encryption by internal control administrators, with system access strictly password-protected to ensure case confidentiality.

#### **Confidentiality Agreements**

Lead investigators are required to execute non-disclosure agreements, legally binding them to protect whistleblower identities and case details.

#### **Whistleblower Protection Measures**

To maintain universal awareness of Sun Art Retail's business ethics standards, we require all employees to annually sign *Integrity Commitment Letters*. Complementing this, we conduct regular integrity training and cultural awareness campaigns to thoroughly communicate corporate ethics policies and corresponding disciplinary measures, thereby sustaining employee vigilance against misconduct.

We have continuously strengthened internal publicity on integrity branding, launching internal integrity branding initiatives include educational series such as "Mr. Integrity's Class", "Ethics Express", and "Leadership Integrity Guidelines", with 26 compliance advisories digitally distributed to all staff.

Beyond routine training, we conduct targeted anti-corruption sessions for high-risk departments.

# Intellectual Property Protection

We strictly adhere to China's core intellectual property regulations including the *Patent Law of the People's Republic of China* and *Trademark Law of the People's Republic of China*, establishing a rigorous compliance framework. Our implemented *Intellectual Property Management System* provides clear governance protocols, standardized procedures, and systematic risk controls to safeguard innovation.

#### **IP Infringement Screening**

Prior to initiating any IP-related activities, novelty searches and comprehensive retrievals must be conducted to prevent authorization uncertainties and infringement claims.

#### **IP Rights Enforcement**

In the event of identified or suspected intellectual property infringement, all business units are required to take immediate action by reporting to and cooperating with the Legal Department for proper resolution. For significant IP infringement cases or litigation matters, the relevant business unit must first submit a formal report or request to the Legal Department, then develop and submit a proposed response plan for legal review and approval prior to implementation.

#### **IP Safeguarding Procedures**

Our comprehensive IP protection system involves proactive registration, filing, and rights confirmation procedures. We maintain rigorous daily monitoring to prevent unauthorized registration of our trademarks, patents, domain names, and trade names. When potential conflicts with Sun Art Retail's intellectual property rights are detected, the Legal Department will initiate appropriate protective measures. All business units must ensure active commercial use of successfully registered trademarks to mitigate risks of cancellation due to three years of non-use ("Three-Year Cancellation").

#### Intellectual Property Protection Mechanism

During the reporting period, we introduced a tiered trademark risk management mechanism, classifying trademarks by usage status and strategic value to prevent cancellation due to non-use ("Three-Year Revocation") and invalidation risks.

#### Class I Trademarks

Active-use trademarks requiring strengthened evidence preservation of commercial utilization.

#### Class II Trademarks

Defensive trademarks not currently in use, which may be employed incidentally with other trademarks in use or re-registered after three years.

#### Class III Trademarks

Inactive trademarks with no operational value, to be voluntarily abandoned upon expiration without renewal.

#### Trademark Classification System

To ensure comprehensive understanding of intellectual property regulations and corporate policies among relevant employees, Sun Art Legal Academy conducted a live training session titled "Corporate IP Policy Dissemination and Interpretation" in September 2024. The program provided in-depth analysis of our *Intellectual Property Management System*, incorporating practical case studies, management methodologies, risk control procedures, and consequences of non-compliance. This holistic approach significantly enhanced participants' theoretical knowledge and practical competencies in IP management.

We rigorously implement national food safety standards in full compliance with the *Food Safety Law of the People's Republic of China* and the *Law on the Protection of Consumer Rights and Interests of the People's Republic of China*, safeguarding consumers' legitimate rights. Our comprehensive quality assurance system spans the entire product lifecycle, ensuring consumers receive safe and reliable products with complete confidence.

# Quality and Safety Management System

We relentlessly pursue product excellence by implementing quality control throughout our entire value chain. Our scientifically rigorous quality management system comprehensively covers every operational stage, from sourcing and production to logistics, warehousing, distribution, in-store supply, and after-sales services. During the reporting period, we established internal regulations including the *Food Safety Disclosure Policy* and *Food Commission Management Rules*, continuously enhancing our systematic and standardized food safety governance framework.

To validate our internal quality systems, we actively pursue third-party certifications. By the end of the reporting period, we had obtained ISO 9000 Quality Management System, ISO 22000 Food Safety Management System, and HACCP Food Safety Control System certifications, demonstrating our unwavering commitment to premium standards. Furthermore, through active participation in industry associations, we continuously refine our quality management practices by incorporating best practices from food industry leaders.

# Quality and Safety Risk Management

We continuously enhance our food safety management systems and accountability frameworks by establishing a primary responsibility system for food safety. Through intelligent monitoring systems, anomaly detection mechanisms, and strict shelf-life management, we ensure optimal food display and storage conditions, effectively reducing quality incidents while comprehensively mitigating food safety risks to protect consumer rights.

# **Food Safety Primary Responsibility System**

We place food quality and safety at the heart of our brand value, implementing comprehensive preventive measures through our *Management Rules on Fulfillment of Entity Responsibility for Food Safety*. This system clearly defines the protocols for dedicated food safety supervisors at each store, emphasizing daily audits and strict adherence to operational standards, thereby integrating food safety management throughout every operational process.

To empower our food safety supervisor in fulfilling their responsibilities, we have implemented a performance evaluation and career advancement mechanism. Regular online assessments motivate continuous professional development, ensuring our teams maintain and enhance their expertise to consistently deliver safe and reliable food products to customers.

#### **Daily Supervision**

 Certified food safety supervisors conduct daily inspections and monitoring at all stores in strict compliance with corporate food safety audit protocols.

#### **Quarterly Training Reinforcement**

• Each quarter, food safety supervisors deliver targeted quality risk awareness training to store staff based on analysis of inspection findings.

#### Third-Party Quarterly Audits

• Independent auditor SGS performs specialized food safety audits at every store quarterly to verify standardized implementation.

#### Annual Risk Assessment

- SGS conducts systematic food safety risk evaluations across regional stores annually.
- Our Internal Control Department simultaneously organizes comprehensive inspections to develop risk summaries and improvement plans.

# **Automated Management System**

We have implemented a web-based temperature monitoring (WEB) system for refrigeration and freezing units across all stores, enabling real-time dynamic tracking of storage conditions. The system incorporates intelligent alert mechanisms calibrated to different food preservation standards, when temperature deviations occur, it automatically sends alerts to each department head via DingTalk. If the issue remains unresolved within the specified timeframe, escalate it to the maintenance staff and then, step by step, to the designated specialists. For critical anomalies, immediately place an automated voice call to the maintenance staff and simultaneously notify the maintenance specialists, creating a closed loop tracking system that ensures optimal food storage temperatures are consistently maintained.

# **Store Abnormality Detection and Analysis**

Leveraging the feedback mechanism of separation and recycling system, we conduct comprehensive abnormality analysis. Our Quality Control Department performs in-depth root cause analysis of store irregularities to pinpoint accountability, implementing daily closed-loop follow-up until 100% corrective action is achieved. For products or stores exceeding anomaly thresholds, we deploy additional quality checkpoints by assigning processing supervisors, weighers, inspectors, and sorters to intensify inspection density throughout the production chain, enabling proactive risk interception that significantly reduces quality incident rates.

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- The Group has established processing center, and the proportion of sampling inspection is carried out in accordance with the "38 Principle" when inspecting products;
- The processing personnel will process the products according to the standard cards for products; the quality control and auditing personnel will conduct secondary inspection of the finished products on site.



- Daily storage auditors conduct full auditing on processed goods in three time periods to check product
  quality, labeling, weight, packaging, etc. Abnormal products need to be reworked and reprocessed, and the
  responsible personnel will be punished;
- For quality abnormality reports from stores, relevant personnel will analyze the category and identify the cause of abnormality, provide additional employee education and intensify the proportion of internal spot checks on the following day, and the responsible personnel will be punished.
- To improve the quality of source products, the sampling inspection ratio for SKUs with quality abnormality complaints on the current day will be doubled:
- Raw materials need to be inspected by the Team Leader/Divisional Leader before processing, those products with abnormal quality require quality control personnel conduct on-site reconfirmation;



- For SKUs with quality abnormality complaints on the current day, auditors are required to conduct sampling inspection on 20% of all finished products, with on-site supervision by the distribution Divisional Leader;
- For stores with more quality abnormality reports, we will further intensify the tracking and analysis of temperature abnormalities using temperature trackers;
- Strict punishment will be imposed for quality abnormality complaints according to the rules, and joint responsibility system is formulated for supervisors, to effectively urge supervisors in on-site supervision.

# **Expiry Date Management**

We prioritize effective shelf-life management through comprehensive measures to ensure product quality. Our *Matters Concerning the Management of the Packaged Products Expiry Dates of Vegetable and Fruit Division* establish product-specific expiration periods based on commodity characteristics, with sell-by dates embedded in barcode systems. Both online picking and offline checkout systems automatically block items exceeding shelf life, preventing register transactions of expired products. We maintain a robust shelf-life management process where the store's internal controllers photograph and report quality anomalies through our Product Quality Abnormality Feedback System. The quality controller of fresh product storage will determine responsibility for inbound quality issues, escalating product-related matters to procurement for resolution. When quality issues stem from store management deficiencies, the system immediately alerts the head of vegetable & fruit division to implement corrective actions.

For short-shelf-life products, we continuously optimize management through precise ordering and turnover control to maintain freshness. Our strict online release period policies require adherence to the "last-in-first-out" principle (e.g., fresh milk released only within the first half of its shelf life). Enhanced physical inventory monitoring and early warning systems enable timely handling of near-expiry products. Standardized clearance procedures, including designated clearance zones, strategic replenishment, and proper display, ensure appropriate management of soon-to-expire goods, minimizing waste while protecting consumer interests.

# Quality and Safety Enhancement Initiatives

We are dedicated to fostering a culture of quality and safety by continuously optimizing every stage of product storage, transportation, and distribution. Through meticulous process management, we ensure all goods maintain optimal conditions throughout the supply chain, delivering comprehensive protection for product safety and quality.

# **Product Warehousing and Transportation**

We strictly adhere to internal management protocols with a focus on packaging optimization during transportation and warehousing. For transportation, we implement precise temperature control during loading, transit, and unloading, utilizing insulated packaging materials and technologies to preserve product integrity. In our warehouses, we maintain customized temperature zones through advanced environmental designs including full-warehouse climate control, variable-temperature work/storage areas, and insulated docking stations, all tailored to specific product categories' preservation requirements. By perfecting cold chain management, heating processes, and packaging methodologies across all operations, we effectively safeguard product quality during storage and transportation. Our integrated approach combines specialized packaging improvements with precision temperature management to maximize product freshness at every stage.

#### Frozen & Refrigerated Products

- Ice cream delivery: packaged with foil bags + dry ice/ice packs + insulated boxes
- Frozen/refrigerated product delivery: packaged with frozen ice particle film + insulated boxes

#### **Hot Prepared Foods**

- Upgraded packaging materials include high-transparency boxes, black-bottom snap-lock boxes, and fried food paper boxes to prevent soup leakage and product damage
- Optimized heating service: products are heated in dedicated areas before shipment, then placed in packaging boxes, wrapped with foil bags for insulation, and finally placed in red bags for delivery

#### **Live Aquatic Products**

To enhance vitality, we employ a triple-safeguard solution—oxygenated bags + ice particle film + insulated boxes: the seafood is sealed in an oxygenated bag along with its original tank water and crushed ice (extra ice packs in summer), the bag is then wrapped in an ice-grain film to lock in cold, and the entire package is placed in a professional insulated box for continuous temperature-controlled delivery.

**Transportation Quality Optimization** 

Hot food products: After heating in dedicated microwaves, products are packaged with specified materials, placed in aluminum foil bags, sealed with foil, and affixed with product labels

Frozen and refrigerated products: Fully wrapped with frozen ice particle film before being placed in insulated boxes

Ice cream products: Packaged with foil bags + dry ice

Fragile items: Packaged with bubble wrap or air columns

Live aquatic products: Packaged in oxygenated bags

Pork and poultry: Added modified atmosphere packaging for freshness preservation

Raw/cooked and food/non-food separation: Packaged using continuous roll bags

# **Order Picking and Delivery**

We have implemented multiple measures to optimize batch order picking and delivery efficiency. By improving internal processes and operational models, we have enhanced the efficiency and effectiveness of warehouse picking and consolidated order delivery, better meeting consumers' demands for fast and accurate delivery services.

#### **Warehouse Picking**

- Pilot testing of integrated front-end picking and packing with zoned picking for low-volume stores to simplify replenishment and batch consolidation processes, thereby reducing costs
- Optimized dock types to flexibly accommodate orders from different channels, with adjusted batch consolidation models to improve processing efficiency
- Improved picking workflows to minimize staff movement and enlarged location markers to increase picking speed
- Eliminated scanning steps for certain order logistics boxes to save packaging time

# **Quality Awareness Enhancement**

We prioritize quality awareness improvement through a comprehensive training and assessment system. We require internal controllers to complete new employee training assessments, participate in quarterly third-party professional training, and conduct training evaluations for store staff based on control results. In 2024, our Internal Control Department launched specialized advancement training, with controllers collaborating with HR to deliver food safety awareness and competency training for all employees. Additionally, we engaged third-party experts to train regional store staff and organized procurement departments to study new food safety regulations and central platform operating standards, training over 300 personnel with follow-up assessments to comprehensively strengthen quality awareness.



# Product Traceability & Recall

We have established an end-to-end product traceability management system, utilizing digital platforms to achieve full supply chain tracking from production to sales, ensuring food safety. Simultaneously, we strictly comply with relevant regulations, maintaining a robust product recall protocol validated through annual recall drills to guarantee operational effectiveness.

# **Product Traceability Management System**

We have established a comprehensive product traceability management system that enables end-to-end tracking of food products from production to sales through digital platforms, ensuring food safety. During the reporting period, we further optimized our traceability platform by expanding its coverage: the "Zhejiang Food Chain" system now covers 46 stores in Zhejiang province, tracing livestock/poultry products, aquatic products, vegetables, fruits, and prepackaged foods; while the "QR Code Traceability System" serves 66 Shanghai stores, primarily for meat products. These initiatives have enhanced traceability efficiency and store management capabilities while strengthening consumer confidence in food safety.

#### **Product Recall**

We strictly comply with regulations including the *Measures for the Administration of Food Recall* and *Interim Provisions on Consumer Product Recall Management*, having established internal policies like the *Product Recall and Disposal Regulations* (Food/Consumer Products) that define mandatory recall procedures. When receiving returned products due to quality issues, stores immediately conduct self-checks regarding production batches, dates, and manufacturers, while reporting to the Group's quality inspection department for source tracing. Upon identifying the root cause, we implement proactive recalls, document the entire process, and conduct thorough analysis for continuous improvement.

# Delivering Nutritious & Healthy Products

We provide consumers with natural, healthy, and safe food products that meet their pursuit of high-quality living. Through owned and partnered brands, we offer low-sugar, low-fat, additive-free, and nutritionally fortified products, expanding organic varieties while reducing artificial ingredients and promoting plant-based alternatives to build a comprehensive healthy food matrix.

#### **Diverse Nutritional Choices**

At Sun Art Retail, our private label products strategically align with health-conscious consumption trends by developing a differentiated product portfolio through collaborations with health-focused brands/manufacturers, directly addressing contemporary consumers' demand for healthier dietary options. In FY 2024/2025, we expanded our health-oriented offerings to include reduced-sugar and clean-label bakery/snack items as well as zero-fat beverages. Our new bakery products feature sugar-free black sesame crisps and low-sugar coconut almond chips, while preservative-free snacks² include spiced duck gizzards, duck necks, and pitted prunes. The zero-fat beverage line now encompasses calamansi lime juice and ruby grapefruit jasmine tea, continuously enriching our healthy product matrix

This year, we partnered with Haitian Flavor to jointly promote "additive-free, organic, and low-sodium" food products. Through this collaboration, we featured zero-additive soy sauce and low-sodium condiments on the homepage of RT-Mart Fresh App, while Haitian Flavor launched splash ads on Tencent Video to reach mass consumers and strengthen health brand awareness. During the campaign period, total sales of relevant categories reached RMB610,000, with the zero-additive/organic/low-sodium series contributing RMB76,000, accounting for 12.5% of total sales and showing an 18.6% sequential growth.

With consumer health needs as our core focus, we actively explore nutrition enhancement initiatives to further improve the nutritional value of our products while maintaining their delicious taste.

# **Organic Products**

We actively expand our organic product assortment across vegetables, fruits, grains, meats and other categories to provide consumers with diverse choices. We strictly adhere to organic certification standards, ensuring every product carries authoritative certification so consumers can shop with confidence and truly experience a natural, healthy, and pollution-free organic lifestyle.

This year, we achieved RMB569 million in national organic product sales, with over 400 organic SKUs spanning daily fresh, snacks, dry goods, and prepared food categories. Our private label offers 46 organic SKUs (including rotated products), traceable to 17 certified organic farms, some categories originating from the same cultivation base.

We place utmost importance on customer privacy rights and data security, strictly adhering to laws and regulations including the *Cybersecurity Law of the People's Republic of China, Law of the People's Republic of China on the Protection of Consumer Rights and Interests*, and GB/T 35273-2017 *Information Security Technology - Personal Information Security Specification*. We have revised and updated a series of internal policies such as the *Kangcheng Investment (China) Co., Ltd. Data Security Standards (Trial) V1.5, R&D Process V2.1, Product Security Checklist V1.4, Mini Program Product Security Checklist V1.0*, and *Supplier Product Security Checklist V1.0* to ensure standardized execution of information security practices. These policies cover all RT-Mart operations including physical stores, Fresh App, and other online platforms.

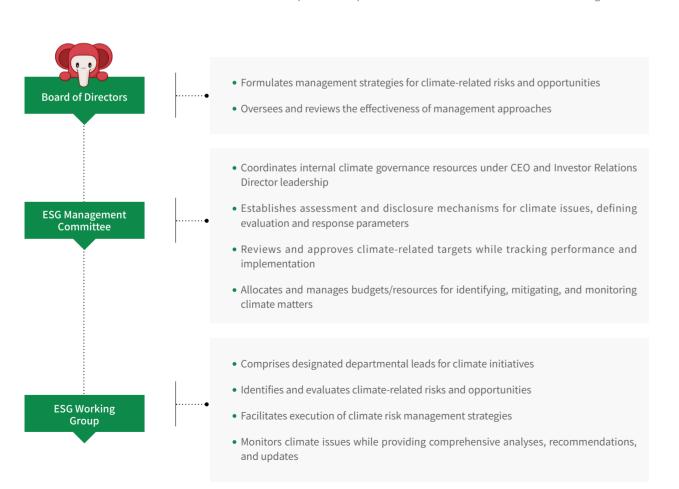


# Climate Change Response

Addressing the complex challenges posed by climate change and effectively capturing opportunities within the green transition has become a critical global imperative requiring collaborative solutions. We prioritize environmental management by integrating climate change risks into our ESG risk framework. Aligning with the Task Force on Climate-related Financial Disclosures (TCFD) and Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited's disclosure recommendations, we systematically identify, assess, and manage climate-related risks and opportunities through active stakeholder collaboration to advance sustainable value chains.

# Climate Change Governance

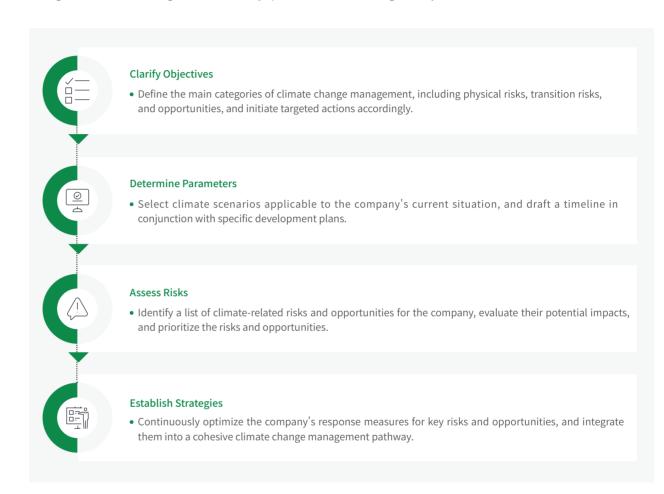
We maintain rigorous focus on climate governance, continuously refining internal management systems and methodologies to enhance effectiveness. Our three-tier governance structure, comprising the Board of Directors, ESG Management Committee, and ESG Working Group, formally embeds climate responsibilities within the ESG framework. The ESG Management Committee regularly reports climate progress to the Board based on working group outputs. Furthermore, through expert-led knowledge sharing, we provide ongoing climate governance training to Board members, equipping them with specialized expertise for informed climate-related decision-making.

# Climate Change Management Strategy

We fully recognize the long-term impacts of climate change on our sustainable development and actively address related challenges through efficient initiatives that drive industry transformation. To enhance our climate response capabilities, we have established a comprehensive climate change management strategy process, operating across four dimensions, governance, strategy, risk management, and metrics/targets, to continuously optimize our climate management system.



#### Climate Change Risk Management Process

We categorize identified climate-related risks into physical risks and transition risks, analyzing their temporal impacts to inform corporate development planning, thereby striving to achieve holistic climate change management.

For developing scientifically grounded strategies, we reference international standards, benchmark industry best practices, and select climate scenarios aligned with our operational reality. During the reporting period, we adopted SSP<sup>3</sup> 1-2.6 and SSP2-4.5 scenarios for physical risks, and IEA NZE<sup>4</sup> 2050 and IEA APS<sup>5</sup> scenarios for transition risks. We also defined temporal parameters for climate impacts: short-term (1 year), medium-term (2-5 years), and long-term (6+ years).

The NZE scenario is a normative pathway proposed by the IEA, requiring the energy sector to achieve net-zero emissions by 2050 without relying on external offsets.

#### Announced Pledges (APS) Scenario:

The APS scenario represents a future energy and emission development pathway based on the climate policies and commitments already announced by national governments, considering the impact of these policy pledges on energy demand, prices, and emissions.

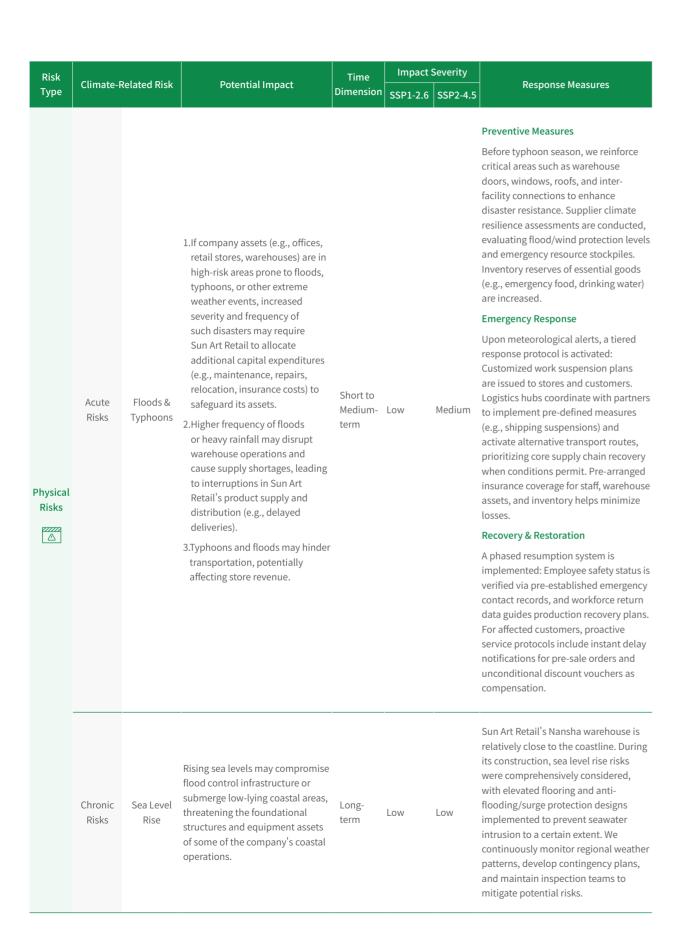
During the reporting period, we further updated the list of climate-related risks and opportunities based on the results of risk identification and assessment. The updated list includes 3 acute physical risks, 1 chronic physical risk, 3 transition risks, and 2 opportunities. The physical risks primarily impact three areas: logistics and transportation, store and warehouse operations, and construction projects. The transition risks mainly affect store and warehouse operations, logistics transportation, and market feedback. To further clarify the priority of actions for addressing climate change, we assessed the degree of impact of each risk and opportunity under different climate scenarios, resulting in a key list of climate-related risks and opportunities, which will serve as a reference for the company in formulating response measures.



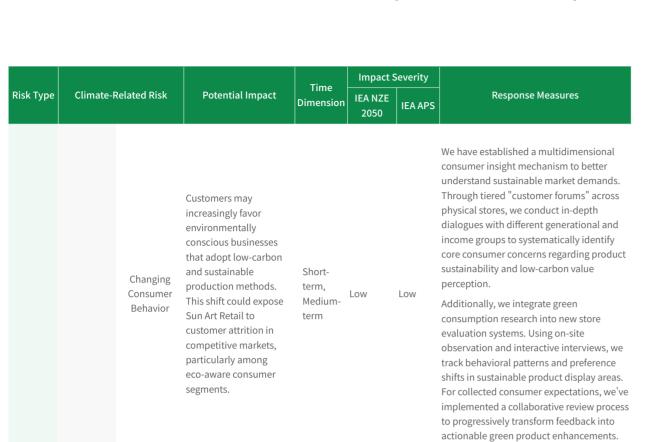

We implement an end-to-end climate risk assessment system to systematically analyze cost-inflation risks from energy price volatility and logistics disruptions, with dedicated contingency reserves for sudden cost surges. Risk mitigation includes property and business interruption insurance to hedge asset losses, combined with futures and options to lock in key material prices, insulating our supply chain from climate-induced market volatility and maintaining cost structure stability.

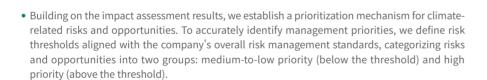

- Based on industry-specific analysis and input from stakeholders and external experts, we
  identify climate-related risks and opportunities relevant to the company and compile them
  into a comprehensive list. We continuously review and update this inventory by monitoring
  global climate policy developments, evolving customer demands regarding climate change,
  and adjustments to the company's low-carbon strategy, ensuring both completeness and
  timeliness.
- For each identified risk and opportunity, we conduct qualitative and quantitative analyses
  of their likelihood, severity, and business relevance to assess their potential impact on the
  company.



- For medium-to-low-priority risks and opportunities, we integrate them into routine monitoring
  systems and periodically evaluate potential changes in their impact. For high-priority items,
  we develop customized response plans, systematically refine management strategies, and
  enhance overall climate risk management capabilities.
- We incorporate climate risk monitoring into the company's overarching risk management
  processes, continuously evaluating the impact levels of climate risks to maintain controllability.
   Designated owners for each climate risk conduct regular monitoring and control activities, ensuring
  that climate-related risks and opportunities are managed across all operational workflows.
- For key climate-related risks and opportunities, the ESG Management Committee periodically reviews their impact and reports to the Board of Directors. The Board evaluates risk control outcomes and makes final decisions on whether to update management strategies.

# Climate Change Metrics and Targets

We have set four environmental targets covering greenhouse gas emission reduction, energy efficiency, water conservation, and waste management. The ESG task force oversees the implementation of these targets, while the ESG management committee monitors progress and reports regularly to the board of directors. The board reviews target achievement and manages all target-setting matters in alignment with corporate development and external factors.

#### **Greenhouse Gas Emissions Management**

Our greenhouse gas emissions stem from gasoline, diesel, and natural gas combustion, refrigerant usage, and purchased electricity. We conduct data collection and analysis for each emission source, systematically evaluating their contribution to total emissions and corresponding reduction potential. Based on this assessment, we develop scientifically viable decarbonization pathways.



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Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction

#### **Target Details**



Sun Art Retail commits to achieving carbon neutrality for Scope 1 and 2 emissions across its operations by 2030.

#### Progress Status



This fiscal year witnessed a 16% reduction in total Scope 1 and Scope 2 greenhouse gas emissions compared to the previous fiscal year.

During the reporting period, we implemented the following emission reduction measures across our stores, warehouses, and transportation operations:

- As of March 31, 2025, we have newly constructed 17 stores equipped with photovoltaic power generation systems, bringing the total number of stores with completed PV projects to 47. The total PV power generation this fiscal year reached approximately 28.00 million kWh.
- In FY2025, we upgraded refrigeration systems in 1 additional store to use more environmentally friendly R448A refrigerant (total: 75 stores), covering approximately 15% of our store network. This builds upon the 74 stores converted in the previous year.
- We continued advancing our clean energy transition in FY2025: Green electricity procurement exceeded 55% for stores in Jiangsu, Anhui, and Zhejiang provinces; Nuclear power utilization reached nearly 85% for Guangdong stores; In Sichuan (new expansion region), 14 stores initiated green electricity procurement, representing over 10% coverage.

Store-Level Emission Reduction Initiatives

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• In East China's Nanjing warehouse, we completed a 40,000 sq.m photovoltaic project with an installed capacity of 4 MW.

• The South China Nansha warehouse project covers 19,000 sq.m of solar panels with 4.3MW installed capacity.

• North China's Jiyang warehouse installed 24,000 sq.m of photovoltaic systems achieving 5.3MW capacity.

 During the reporting period, photovoltaic systems at Suzhou, Nanjing and Jiyang warehouses became operational, generating approximately 1.72 million kWh this fiscal year.

Warehouse Emission Reduction Initiatives

- In Northeast China's Shenyang warehouse, we optimized delivery routes by prioritizing national highway transportation during favorable road conditions while simultaneously implementing backhaul services to reduce empty runs. During the reporting period, we completed 541 backhaul trips.
- Central China operations maintained external backhaul services while meeting store demands. Through optimized load consolidation, our Chibi warehouse achieved 76% loading rate, with all return trips to external stores operating at full capacity.
- East China's Suzhou warehouse streamlined transport routes for Wuxi and Zhangjiagang deliveries, reducing average daily mileage by approximately 9km per store.
- In North China's Jinan warehouse, route optimizations yielded 5km savings per trip, accumulating 9,000km in annual mileage reduction.
- South China's Xiamen warehouse achieved 30km single-trip distance savings through route optimization.

# **Environmental Management System**

# **Environmental Policy**

We strictly comply with national and local regulations in all our operational jurisdictions, including but not limited to the *Environmental Protection Law of the People's Republic of China*, the *Energy Conservation Law of the People's Republic of China*, the *Water Pollution Prevention and Control Law of the People's Republic of China*, the *Solid Waste Pollution Environment Prevention and Control Law of the People's Republic of China*, and the *SB/T10814-2012 Supermarket Waste Disposal Guidelines*. To ensure effective implementation of environmental management, we have established internal governance instruments such as the *Environmental Protection Charter* and *Energy Control Management Standards*, which define environmental performance benchmarks, clarify departmental environmental responsibilities, and continuously enhance our corporate environmental management standards.

#### **Governance Structure**

We have established environmental management frameworks at corporate, organizational, and store levels to ensure rigorous implementation of environmental management practices across our operations. The Group's Board of Directors and executive management serve as the supreme responsible body for environmental governance, with all management structures adopting a top-down approach that clearly defines responsibilities at each level and implements specialized management protocols.

# Management System & Environmental Audits

During the reporting period, we maintained ISO 14001 Environmental Management System certification. We conduct regular internal environmental audits and external reviews to verify the effectiveness and regulatory compliance of our environmental management system, covering 100% of operational locations.



# **Environmental Objectives**

We have established three key environmental objectives focusing on energy efficiency, water conservation, and waste reduction. The ESG Working Group is responsible for implementing the roadmap to achieve these targets, while the ESG Management Committee oversees execution progress and regularly reports to the Board of Directors. The Board conducts periodic reviews of target achievement and progress assessment.

# **Energy Management**

We continuously enhance our Energy Maintenance Management System to strengthen Sun Art Retail's digital management capabilities and improve environmental responsiveness. Jointly operated by regional monitoring centers and the headquarters control center, this system supports store operations in multiple aspects including data collection, energy consumption analysis, system alerts, and electricity usage audits. During the reporting period, we optimized system functionalities to further elevate our digital energy management standards.

#### Refrigeration System Alarms

To enhance risk early-warning capabilities for store cold chain systems, we implemented functional upgrades to the refrigeration equipment monitoring system, with a focus on adding new alert mechanisms for abnormal data collection and network communication interruptions. This effectively prevents delays in alarm notifications caused by network transmission failures or controller malfunctions, reduces food safety risks resulting from equipment monitoring failures, and provides dual safeguards for food storage environment safety.

#### **Energy Data Upload Notifications**

To strengthen energy data governance efficiency, we implemented standardized management by integrating store energy usage records into the energy management system while simultaneously adding an intelligent audit function module. Through deploying an active warning mechanism for missing documentation, the system can instantly identify and flag unsubmitted data, shortening manual verification cycles while improving the energy data traceability system. This substantially enhances the completeness and reliability of operational data.

New Features of Energy (Maintenance) Management System

During the reporting period, leveraging the Energy (Maintenance) Management System enabled 24/7 dynamic monitoring of store operations. We successfully identified and addressed four categories of abnormal incidents while achieving precise energy consumption control, with estimated energy savings of 8 million kWh for this cycle.

Identified a total of 108 cases of abnormal air conditioning system operation (including parameter setting deviations and failure to promptly shut down during non-business hours).

Conducted 190 corrective actions to address equipment management gaps as part of the special project to enhance kitchen exhaust fan operational efficiency.

Detected 358 instances of abnormal electricity usage during energy audits.

Triggered 132 significant abnormal shutdown warnings for refrigeration equipment (including 56 occurrences during night hours).

#### Energy (Maintenance) Management System Energy-Saving Initiatives

We have also implemented the following initiatives across all stores to further reduce energy consumption:



#### Elevator 3D Radar Project

We have installed radar motion sensors on infrequently used elevators at select stores, enabling automatic activation when customers approach and delayed shutdown after departure. As of the reporting period, 261 elevators across 89 stores have been retrofitted, projecting annual electricity savings of approximately 1.6 million kWh.



#### Refrigeration Cabinet Management

We conducted comprehensive audits of all store refrigeration units through online and offline methods, implementing operational parameter adjustments chainwide. Simultaneously, we refined compressor suction pressure regulation for refrigeration systems, achieving annual energy savings of around 3 million kWh through optimized equipment performance.

# **Emissions Management**

We generate various emissions in our operations, including greenhouse gases, air pollutants from vehicle operations, wastewater, and waste materials. We strictly comply with relevant laws and regulations, adhere to compliant disposal principles, consistently commit to reducing emissions at source, and actively implement recycling initiatives.

To systematically monitor and control operational emissions, we have established comprehensive management systems addressing three key dimensions: waste, wastewater, and gaseous emissions.

#### Waste



We require all stores to input daily waste data into the system, with designated specialists conducting monthly audits of the entered data to promptly identify anomalies, determine their causes, and develop corrective action plans.

#### Wastewater



Using water consumption as our core monitoring metric, we mandate stores to record daily water usage data, followed by monthly tracking and analysis across all locations. We investigate any data anomalies or fluctuating trends and promptly address irregularities.

#### **Gaseous Emissions**



With energy consumption and refrigerant usage as key monitoring indicators for greenhouse gas sources, we have established a comprehensive management and analysis system covering all refrigerant lifecycle stages. This enables real-time monitoring of store consumption and inventory levels, allowing operational status assessments based on safety stock levels. We investigate abnormal consumption patterns at stores and implement timely resolutions.

# **Gaseous Emissions Management**

Gasoline and diesel combustion from our owned vehicle fleet constitutes Sun Art Retail's primary source of gaseous pollutant emissions. We are progressively replacing conventional fuel vehicles with new energy vehicles to reduce total air pollutant emissions. As of the reporting period, our fleet includes 10 new energy vehicles deployed in daily operations.

During the reporting period, our gaseous emissions<sup>12</sup> (excluding greenhouse gases) were as follows:

# **Wastewater Management**

Our wastewater primarily originates from store water consumption. We adhere to compliant discharge principles, channeling all operationally generated wastewater through municipal sewage networks for centralized treatment. Committed to source reduction, we have implemented wastewater storage and recycling systems on purified water equipment, redirecting process wastewater to cleaning points for reuse, achieving wastewater recycling.

# **Waste Management**

We generate waste streams comprising paper products, plastics, corrugated cardboard, foam materials, food waste, used oil, metals, and minimal hazardous waste. Implementing tri-zone segregation principles across stores, we deploy categorized waste bins tailored to shopping arcades, sales floors, and office areas, ensuring comprehensive waste collection and sorting.

As our primary recyclable waste, we govern cardboard handling through standardized
 Store Cardboard Recycling Procedures, specifying full-process operational protocols.
 Store departments deposit eligible cardboard at receiving area holding points,
 where warehouse staff coordinate manufacturer personnel for joint weighing and
 documentation under surveillance. Post loss-prevention checks, materials are baled
 externally, with standardized data recording for audit trails. Headquarters conducts
 monthly data verification to identify anomalies, determine root causes, and implement
 corrective actions.

## Waste Oil Recycling Program

- We launched the waste oil recycling initiative in FY2024. Partnering with specialized
  collaborators, we employ biomass utilization technology to transform waste grease
  from stores into high-quality bio-based raw materials. These materials serve dual
  applications: production of renewable diesel and hydrogenated vegetable oil as
  alternatives to conventional diesel, and manufacturing of sustainable aviation fuel.
- As of the reporting period, 106 stores have enrolled in this recycling program.

#### **Waste Sorting**

- We strictly comply with municipal regulations across all operating cities, implementing standardized internal sorting procedures for food waste, with dedicated staff verifying proper dry-wet separation at stores. Through strategically placed categorized waste bins, we enhance customer awareness of eco-conscious waste classification.
- Currently, 450 stores across 150 cities have adopted our waste sorting system.

#### **Food Loss & Waste Reduction**

- We maintain stringent disposal protocols and standardized operating procedures
  for expired food products, with comprehensive system monitoring to prevent
  unauthorized circulation. To minimize food waste, we implement full-chain loss
  control management spanning procurement, storage, processing, and retail
  operations. Professional third-party partners facilitate closed-loop treatment of
  organic waste.
- The reporting period saw an 8,154.85-ton reduction (21.44% decrease) in food waste, surpassing our FY2023/2024 target of 5% reduction. We have established a new FY2025/2026 target to achieve 5% further reduction compared to FY2024/2025 levels.

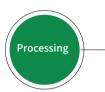

We maintain hygienic storage conditions and enforce standardized food preservation protocols. Temperature-sensitive products undergo strict climate-controlled storage to prevent spoilage.



Our food processing personnel strictly adhere to standardized operating procedures, ensuring sanitary conditions throughout production to minimize operational waste.



We implement online pre-sales programs based on historical data and foot traffic analytics to forecast demand, optimizing production and procurement quantities to prevent overproduction.

# Water Resource Usage

We prioritize responsible water resource utilization at Sun Art Retail, implementing water-saving devices, wastewater recycling systems, and conservation signage to continuously reduce water consumption throughout our operations.





By reducing both electricity usage and water consumption for air conditioning, each store saves approximately 1,500 tons of water annually, and the total annual water savings for the entire group reach 700,000 tons, achieving dual energy-saving effects.

#### **Water Management Mechanism**



In-store maintenance personnel conduct daily inspections of water facilities and promptly address any abnormalities. The headquarters generates monthly water usage analysis reports and conducts timely inspections when abnormalities are detected, thereby reducing the risk of major leaks.

During the reporting period, all water resources used by Sun Art Retail were sourced from municipal supply networks, with detailed usage as follows:

# **Plastic Reduction Management**

We are dedicated to reducing plastic usage in our operations to minimize environmental impact. During the reporting period, we strictly implemented the *CS00086 Garbage Bag Allocation and Usage Standard* across all stores, enforcing standardized supervision of garbage bag specifications for various waste bins. By identifying potential reuse scenarios and safety protocols for garbage bags, we help stores reduce unnecessary plastic bag consumption. Additionally, we deployed corporate specialists to track garbage bag usage, conducting monthly audits of store expenditures on garbage bags and performing onsite inspections to ensure compliant and efficient operations. As of the end of the reporting period, our expenditure on garbage bags decreased by 2.7% year-on-year.

We have implemented multiple plastic reduction initiatives focused on increasing plastic product reuse rates and prioritizing biodegradable alternatives.





During the reporting period, we standardized procurement of all fresh produce warehouse transport vehicles through headquarters, achieving 100% adoption of recyclable plastic logistics containers across our operations.

As of the reporting period, 282 Sun Art Retail stores have implemented biodegradable plastic shopping bags, representing a net increase of 31 stores compared to the previous fiscal year.

RT-Mart partnered with Procter & Gamble to launch the "Empty Bottles for New Products" joint initiative, establishing a closed-loop recycling system through container return mechanisms. Consumers can exchange any number of empty bottles for exclusive Olympic champion notebooks at participating stores, with select locations offering personalized plastic upcycling workshops. Participants may also contribute to subsequent community programs where the company donates ping pong tables to neighborhood centers.

# **Packaging Material Management**

We continuously evaluate and analyze packaging material usage scenarios to reduce consumption. During the reporting period, we promoted more efficient mobile packaging machines and actively identified opportunities to minimize stretch film usage in operational processes.

#### **Promotion of High-Efficiency Mobile Packaging Machines**



To enhance nationwide store logistics efficiency and merchandise delivery quality, we officially launched a mobile packaging equipment upgrade initiative. Current workflows suffer from excessive manual packaging and inefficient loose pallet handling, while traditional fixed packaging equipment fails to meet dynamic store needs due to space constraints and inflexibility. The upgrade focuses on deploying new mobile packaging systems that will systematically improve consumables efficiency (including stretch film) and transform store receiving processes toward standardization and consolidation.





#### **Reducing Packaging Material Usage in Business Operations**



To minimize unnecessary packaging consumption, improve recycling rates, and advance green supply chain development, we have implemented region-specific eco-friendly operational solutions: In Central China, we established a graded recycling system for cardboard waste, transforming used cartons into reusable logistics containers through standardized sorting, while also repurposing them as pallet protective padding, creating a complete secondary utilization chain for paper products. In South China, we comprehensively optimized packaging structures by introducing reusable fabric wrapping systems during return sorting to replace traditional consumables. For shelf stocking, we adopted adjustable strapping solutions for standard-sized products, enhancing storage efficiency while systematically reducing non-essential material consumption, thereby improving overall resource utilization.

During the reporting period, our packaging material usage data is as follows:

# Biodiversity and Animal Welfare

# **Biodiversity Conservation**

Maintaining ecological resource integrity serves as a fundamental pillar for achieving sustainable socioeconomic development and plays a crucial regulatory role in addressing climate change challenges. As a modern retail service provider, while we have no direct involvement in ecological resource exploitation within our commodity circulation processes, we consistently integrate eco-friendly principles into our operational systems. Through collaborative efforts with upstream and downstream supply chain partners to establish an environmental responsibility ecosystem, we continuously explore innovative pathways for low-carbon operations. We transform resource conservation awareness into tangible green consumption behaviors, advancing ecological civilization from industry practice to societal consensus.

#### RT-Mart + Lux Green Hada Initiative



The "Lux Green Hada" represents Lux's plateau grassland restoration philanthropic program. Since its 2011 launch, the project has scientifically cultivated over 20,000 mu (  $\approx 1,333$  hectares) of pastureland on plateaus, sequestering nearly 9,000 tons of CO<sub>2</sub>. During the reporting period, RT-Mart renewed its partnership with Lux, promoting the Green Hada campaign across 500 nationwide stores to rehabilitate grasslands in Damxung, Qinghai and other Tibetan Plateau regions. The initiative supported nearly 30,000 local farmers and herders in increasing productivity and income, with cumulative philanthropic contributions reaching approximately RMB13.5 million.







#### RT-Mart + P&G Empty Bottle Recycling 3.0 - Store Ping Pong Table Donation



In 2024, RT-Mart partnered with P&G to launch the "Empty Bottle Recycling 3.0" campaign. The initiative comprised two components, "Empty Bottles for New Products" and "Bottle Ping Challenge", inviting customers to redeem prizes by returning empty containers at stores and participate in follow-up ping pong tournaments. Through coordinated efforts across 20+ nationwide stores, locations in East, North, and Central China have donated tournament tables to community centers and rural schools, spreading environmental vibrancy while co-creating healthier lifestyles.



#### **Animal Welfare**

We actively expand our assortment of animal welfare-certified products, strengthening animal rights awareness throughout our supply chain. We rigorously supervise and collaborate with suppliers to scientifically develop and implement animal husbandry and processing solutions that meet international welfare standards.

#### Non-Teeth-Clipped Pork

 We partnered with Henan Muyuan Group to eliminate traditional teeth-clipping practices, ensuring animal welfare. During the reporting period, we achieved RMB27 million in welfare pork sales at 15 pilot stores in East China, representing 4.2% of pork category performance at these locations.

#### Cage-Free Chicken/Eggs

- We proactively source poultry from Fujian Sunner Group and Tyson Foods' cage-free systems, prioritizing chicken products meeting humane slaughter standards. Our welfare-compliant poultry products reached 234 stores nationally, generating RMB36.86 million in sales (6.25% of RT-Mart's poultry category).
- Following successful piloting in East China, we officially expanded cage-free egg distribution to South China. This fiscal year witnessed cage-free egg sales exceeding RMB10 million with 200% year-over-year growth.

• Our grass-fed beef products come from traditionally free-grazed cattle on Australian natural pastures. Available in 234 stores nationwide, these products delivered RMB225.06 million in sales, accounting for 80% of RT-Mart's beef category revenue.

Hormone-Free/ Antibiotic-Free Poultry East China's 232 stores successfully introduced six antibiotic-free poultry products (RMB3.18 million sales) alongside six hormone-free variants (RMB16.86 million sales), demonstrating strong market acceptance.







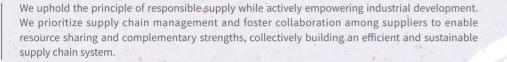

# Sustainable Procurement

We are establishing a comprehensive traceability system covering products' entire lifecycle. We prioritize sourcing products certified with MSC, OFDC, RSPO, and FSSC 22000 standards, strengthening supply chain traceability across all suppliers to create a closed-loop sustainable procurement ecosystem.

#### **Dairy Products Traceability**



During the reporting period, we achieved full origin-to-shelf traceability for 80 dairy product SKUs, generating RMB424 million in sales.

#### **Beef Products Traceability**



As of the reporting period, 234 stores in East China achieved 100% origin traceability for all beef products, with complete origin labeling on packaging. Regional beef sales reached RMB240 million this year.

#### Seafood Traceability



Our origin-traceable seafood products realized over RMB95 million in sales, representing 35% of national fresh aquatic sales. MSC-certified products contributed more than RMB58 million, accounting for 34% of packaged frozen seafood performance.

#### Palm Oil Traceability



14.4% of snack foods and 10.1% of dry groceries obtained palm oil certifications (e.g. RSPO), ensuring supply chain transparency.

# **Guaranteed Highquality Supply**

We are dedicated to building an efficient supply chain management system that enhances risk control through standardized supplier access process, daily management, and rigorous evaluation processes. Through close collaboration and capacity-building initiatives, we provide suppliers with professional training and resource support to drive sustainable supply chain development.

# **Supplier Access**

We have developed a comprehensive supplier qualification and audit system based on national food safety standards, international quality requirements, and our operational characteristics. The audit covers multiple dimensions including supplier credentials, corporate risks, transportation risks, and packaging materials. Suppliers must submit a "Qualification Evaluation Form", with our procurement team reviewing compliance and risk factors, while the Quality Inspection Department evaluates product quality and production environments. Additionally, product compliance reports issued by third-party testing agencies serve as critical approval criteria.

#### **Own-Brand Suppliers**

- Internal & External Audits: The qualification audit process is jointly conducted by our corporate Quality & Safety Department and accredited third-party agencies. Our audit protocol specifies clear pass criteria with tiered classifications (e.g. intermediate level requires ≥ 75% overall score), with corresponding surveillance audit frequencies assigned based on supplier performance ratings.
- Audit Focus Areas: Our evaluations comprehensively assess manufacturing site quality control capabilities, quality system design, environmental/ social responsibility compliance, and sustainable development initiatives to enhance risk management.

#### Non-Own-Brand Suppliers

- Supplier Compliance: Completion of our "Qualification Assessment Form" with procurement teams evaluating regulatory compliance and corporate risks
- Manufacturer Compliance: Verification of actual manufacturers' legal operating credentials
- Product Compliance: Review of product certifications and third-party inspection reports
- Factory Audit Compliance: On-site assessments of production environments and risk control systems to facilitate operational improvements

Sun Art Retail Supplier Access Requirements

Throughout the qualification process, we incorporate sustainable development criteria including environmental management, climate change response, and labor rights protection as key selection metrics, awarding bonus points to exemplary performers. We prioritize suppliers with HACCP/ISO 22000 certification, and particularly favor food producers with registered capital exceeding RMB5 million that hold CGF14-recognized system certifications.

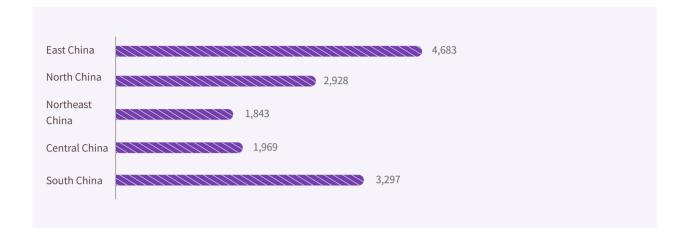

## Supplier Management

To ensure stable supply chain operations, we continuously optimize our supplier management mechanisms. Through regular supplier risk assessments and proactive implementation of localized procurement strategies, we effectively mitigate risks in transportation and sourcing processes, thereby strengthening the foundation for building a sustainable supply chain system.

## **Post-access Management**

We implement tiered classification management for qualified suppliers and establish comprehensive end-to-end control mechanisms to enhance supply chain risk management. Our approach includes pre-assessment evaluation, real-time monitoring, and post-transaction tracking of key supplier performance indicators such as raw material traceability, product qualification rates, and delivery efficiency. This enables us to closely monitor supply chain risks while systematically improving supply chain resilience.



Sun Art Retail Supplier Categories

To ensure supply chain stability and efficiency, we conduct regular on-site inspections of supplier facilities to comprehensively evaluate their operations. During these assessments, we focus on multiple critical aspects including documentation updates and compliance, business ethics, labor rights, and environmental management. Throughout the reporting period, we identified no incidents of employee rights violations within our supply chain.

#### Vehicle matching and external vehicle carrier suppliers

- All vehicles are required to be equipped with GPS.
   While ensuring the traceability of purchased materials, information technology should be used to optimize distribution routes, improve transportation efficiency, and achieve energy conservation and emission reduction.
- When the contract expires every year, open bidding will be conducted for the suppliers of external carriers to filter underperforming transportation companies.
- Suppliers' performance in delivery punctuality rate, receipt timeliness rate, customer satisfaction, driver cooperation, and accident rate, are assessed on a monthly basis.
- By creating electronic files for trucks and controlling the temperature throughout the process, we aim to ensure food safety and reduce food waste.

#### Suppliers of consumables, equipment, and engineering

- The suppliers shall provide various qualification certificates to ensure their accuracy and validity.
- The suppliers are required to provide the information including the performance and proportion of major customers, the number of employees, the area/ ownership, the source of goods, etc., in order to ensure its traceability in products.
- We verify the authenticity of information provided by the suppliers through relevant websites, and check any regulatory violation through Qichacha website to ensure the suppliers' conformancewith business ethics

#### Labor dispatching suppliers

- We ensure that dispatched employees get equal pay and compensation for equal work in the same workplace.
   The rules on employment, assessment, rewards and disincentives are made open and consistent, to safeguard the rights and interests of employees.
- We maintain regular communication with dispatched suppliers to keep abreast of market conditions and employees' working conditions, so as to make active and timely adjustments accordingly. We regularly screen and replace disqualified suppliers according to the cooperation situations.
- We perform monthly interviews and surveys with dispatched employees to understand the suppliers' operation conditions in a timely manner, so as to maintain supply chain stability

#### Fresh Warehouse Carriers

- Transport vehicles are required to be equipped with the G7 system and related equipment to enable automatic alarming in case of abnormal temperature events, so as to prevent quality and safety problems and waste of fresh products caused by transportation.
- The auditors review carriage temperatures during the distribution process and inform the transportation companies of any abnormalities on a daily basis, requesting and assisting the suppliers to make improvements.
- Goods delivery receipts shall be signed and confirmed by the carriers, Loss Prevention Department, and stores, and the traceability and quality assurance of food shall be strictly controlled.

This comprehensive approach safeguards product quality and brand reputation across all own-brand offerings.

#### On-site factory audit

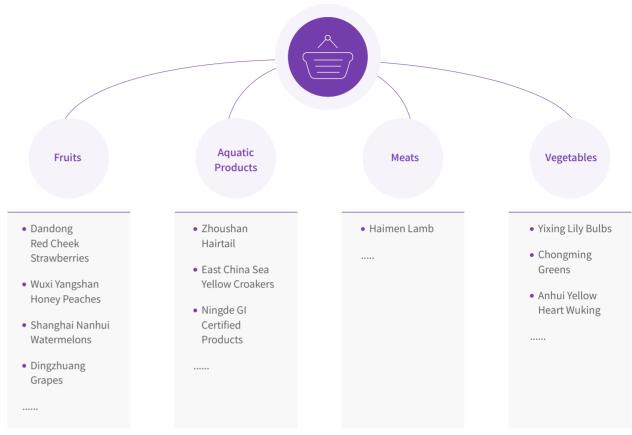
Any potential manufacturers that have been screened out must pass the on-site factory audit by the Own-Brand Quality Department. During the audit, the factory will be evaluated from many aspects, including its overall condition, production management, quality system, simulation traceability, environmental and social responsibilities



To strengthen long-term supplier relationships and ensure supply chain stability, we conduct regular manufacturer audits to comprehensively evaluate partners' production capabilities, identify potential risks, and implement timely corrective actions. This fiscal year, we have completed audits for 1,022 manufacturers.

#### **Localized Procurement**

We actively promote localized procurement, expanding our assortment of regional fruits, seafood, meats, and vegetables through direct contracts with local producers. By increasing geographical-indication product offerings and shortening supply chains, we significantly reduce transportation waste and enhance fresh product quality.

## Supplier Business Ethics Management

we achieved 100% signing rate of the *Commitment Letter* on *Integrity and Trustworthiness* with all partnered suppliers

We prioritize business ethics management, standardizing our own commercial conduct while actively guiding suppliers to uphold integrity. During supplier qualification audits and first production engagements, we clearly communicate and require suppliers to sign the *Commitment Letter on Integrity and Trustworthiness*, simultaneously establishing feedback channels for ethical concerns to ensure suppliers understand and comply with ethical business terms. For own-brand suppliers, we include a *Cooperation Integrity Confirmation Letter* on the first page of the *Own-Brand Procurement Agreement*, explicitly stating complaint reporting procedures to reinforce ethical requirements. Should any supplier violate commitments or demonstrate untrustworthy behavior, Sun Art Retail immediately blacklists them and terminates cooperation.

During the reporting period, we achieved 100% signing rate of the *Commitment Letter on Integrity and Trustworthiness* with all partnered suppliers. Furthermore, we treat all anti-corruption cases with utmost seriousness, guaranteeing case acceptance within 5 business days and investigation launch within 7-14 business days to ensure efficient resolution. All investigations are completed within a maximum three-month period, rigorously maintaining ethical business standards.

## Seamless and Effective Bidirectional Communication

We prioritize close collaboration and seamless communication with our suppliers. We have established an open, transparent, and diversified supplier communication mechanism. Through various initiatives such as supplier training programs and supplier support projects, we continuously optimize resource allocation and enhance operational synergy during our partnerships. These efforts significantly contribute to building a sustainable supply chain while laying a solid foundation for mutual market expansion and shared success.

## Communication with Suppliers

We actively conduct diverse supplier exchange and training activities covering critical areas including food safety and logistics management. These initiatives aim to strengthen communication and coordination with manufacturers, jointly ensuring efficient and stable supply chain operations.

#### **Regular Nationwide Warehouse Training Sessions**



Our warehouses across China regularly organize training sessions for manufacturers, inviting both newly onboarded and existing suppliers. These comprehensive sessions detail warehouse logistics workflows and operational standards, enabling suppliers to better align with our storage and distribution requirements to improve delivery efficiency and quality. Furthermore, the meetings systematically compile and analyze historical delivery issues, providing targeted guidance and solutions to help suppliers familiarize themselves with operational procedures and enhance service quality.

## Supplier Empowerment

Symphony of Ecology: Sustaining Nature

We remain dedicated to mutual growth and win-win collaboration with our suppliers. Through technical guidance, resource coordination, and management optimization initiatives, we fully support supplier development to enhance their core competitiveness, building a tightly integrated, stable, and synergistic supply chain ecosystem.

#### **Quality Mentorship for Local Specialty Producers**



During the reporting period, we conducted in-depth quality mentorship programs for specialty product manufacturers in Fuyuan, Heilongjiang. These efforts helped improve their quality control systems and product standards while actively expanding sales channels to bring Fuyuan's distinctive products to broader markets. Building on our established partnership, we introduced Far East International's fresh corn into our own-brand lineup, achieving remarkable sales performance through superior quality and effective marketing. This empowerment initiative not only provided substantial support for Fuyuan's specialty industry development but also enriched our product portfolio, creating shared value for both parties.





## **Safeguarding Employee** Rights

We prioritize employee rights protection at the strategic level, implementing comprehensive safeguards covering the entire employment lifecycle. We strictly comply with national regulations including the Labor Law of the People's Republic of China and Social Insurance Law of the People's Republic of China, having established standardized systems such as our Employee Handbook. Our closed-loop management system oversees critical phases from recruitment to ongoing employment, with specialized protocols for protecting female employees and preventing workplace injuries. We maintain zero tolerance for violations, ensuring all employees benefit from dual legal and institutional protection.

## **Employment Practices**

We rigorously adhere to local regulations including the Prohibition of Child Labor Regulations, while aligning with international standards like ILO conventions and OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises. Our standardized recruitment processes explicitly prohibit child and forced labor, with all candidates undergoing multi-tiered verification through our HRIS. To ensure labor compliance, we will immediately activate contingency protocols upon identifying any irreqularities (including but not limited to child labor or unsigned employment contracts), implement corrective actions in accordance with laws, and proactively cooperate with regulatory authorities to safequard workers' lawful rights and interests. Multiple grievance channels including email, hotline, and whistleblower mailbox ensure employee voices are heard. As of the reporting period, we have recorded zero incidents of illegal employment practices.

We consistently implement campus recruitment and social hiring strategies to attract high-caliber talent through multiple channels. Furthermore, we continuously optimize our flexible employment platform by exploring outsourced staffing models for roles such as customer acquisition and product sampling. Through platform features including visual scheduling, fragmented shift arrangements, and real-time monitoring of working hour limits, we have significantly improved job matching efficiency while achieving closed-loop management of the entire recruitment, employment, and payroll process. Additionally, we have established a 24/7 risk response team and implemented advance salary payments when third-party platforms experience settlement delays, ensuring all employees, including dispatched workers, receive their lawful entitlements.

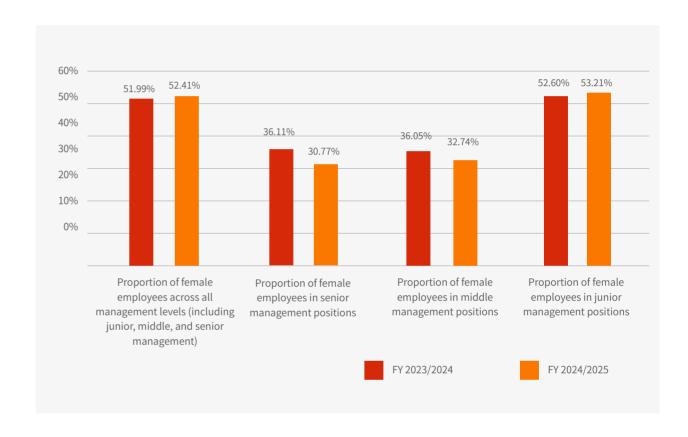
## **Workforce Diversity**

## Compensation & Benefits

We uphold compliance and fairness as fundamental principles of our compensation management, strictly adhering to national and local wage regulations while maintaining equal pay for equal work. Through continuous refinement of our compensation and benefits system, we effectively enhance employee motivation and organizational commitment. Our market-aligned compensation policies, designed with industry benchmarking, attract and retain top talent with highly competitive packages.

## **Compensation Management**

Leveraging our robust digital compensation management system, we have achieved centralized, unified, and standardized salary administration. This integrated platform consolidates previously decentralized store-level payroll functions at headquarters, significantly improving operational efficiency. Our corporate compensation team maintains regular communication with stores to collect feedback and iteratively optimize processes, ensuring system fairness and transparency. Furthermore, we strengthen internal training and knowledge sharing to enhance staff competencies, providing solid support for effective compensation management.

We strictly comply with all local labor regulations, providing compensation that exceeds regional minimum wage standards for every employee. Our position-based salary system directly links remuneration to job performance, institutionally guaranteeing equal pay for equal work regardless of gender.

Regarding salary structure, we have established a unified incentive compensation system offering all staff both fixed and variable pay components, with performance-based variable bonuses. Our total rewards package comprises base salary, performance bonuses, equity incentives and retirement benefits. Eligible employees may participate in long-term incentive programs including the Employee Trust Benefit Schemes (ETBS) alongside retirement savings plans.

For non-employee direct workers (e.g., hourly, temporary, and promotional staff), we implement annual pay adjustments based on project and outsourcing arrangements to offset rising living costs and ensure basic livelihood security.

During the reporting period, we reformed our incentive structure by increasing the proportion of mid-to-long-term incentives, fostering employee ownership mentality and encouraging sustainable business practices.



## **Employee Benefits**

We fully meet legal requirements under the *Labor Law of the People's Republic of China*, providing comprehensive social insurance (pension, medical, unemployment, work injury, maternity) and housing provident fund contributions. Beyond statutory benefits, we offer extensive welfare programs including festival allowances, team-building activities, commercial insurance and employee wellness events.

#### **Paid Annual Leave**

We provide paid annual leave commensurate with employees' job levels and years of service, fully respecting their right to take vacations.

#### **Holiday Benefits**

We organize team-building activities during holidays to enrich employees' personal lives and strengthen team cohesion.

#### **Commercial Insurance Benefits**

We provide supplemental commercial health insurance to reduce employees' medical expenses and deliver comprehensive healthcare protection.

#### **Special Care Benefits**

We offer congratulatory gifts for new parents and hardship assistance funds, demonstrating care and support during employees' significant life events or difficulties.

#### **Meal Benefits**

We provide either complimentary work meals or meal allowances to address dining needs and enhance job satisfaction.

We grant parental leave and paternity leave, enabling employees to better balance work and family commitments.

#### **Employee Share Ownership Benefits**

Eligible employees participate in the ETBS, sharing long-term company gains while strengthening organizational commitment.

For female employees, we provide comprehensive parental leave benefits including maternity leave, childbirth leave, and childcare leave for female employees. In full compliance with local regulations, married full-time male employees are entitled to fully paid paternity leave upon their legal spouse's childbirth, with the leave duration determined by regional government policies.

At Sun Art Retail, we consider our employees the core driving force behind corporate growth and are committed to building a multi-dimensional development ecosystem where every individual can unlock their potential and achieve career advancement. We have established a comprehensive performance evaluation system supported by structured training programs and digital learning platforms to guide and facilitate employee progression. Our training curriculum encompasses both tailored job-specific skill enhancement courses and advanced modules covering cutting-edge industry insights and leadership development, enabling continuous professional growth amidst evolving business landscapes and fostering mutual development for both employees and the company.

### Career Advancement

We place talent retention at the heart of our strategy by cultivating a people-oriented culture and implementing diverse development mechanisms including career planning, cross-functional rotations, and project-based learning opportunities. Our well-established promotion management system evaluates candidates based on role competency and professional capabilities rather than seniority, allowing strategically minded individuals with transformational abilities to advance. During the reporting period, we enhanced our online assessment platform, streamlining evaluation processes while standardizing talent benchmarks across all locations.

To address industry-wide talent mobility challenges, we have intensified our corporate culture initiatives and workplace experience optimization efforts to improve overall retention rates. The company's total employee turnover rate for the reporting period stood at 16.39%, with category-specific breakdowns as follows:

## Performance Management

We have established a comprehensive and scientific performance management system that utilizes evaluation results as key reference indicators for talent pipeline development. By applying objective management methodologies to conduct performance assessments. we systematically cascade corporate strategic objectives across all levels to ensure effective strategy implementation. Tailoring our approach to different position characteristics, we implement a tiered and categorized performance management mechanism that continuously optimizes the fairness, transparency, and effectiveness of evaluation criteria, thereby fully unleashing employee potential and team vitality. We conduct ongoing performance evaluations and feedback processes adapted to various organizational levels and positions, implementing annual assessments with quarterly reviews for management, quarterly evaluations for stores and staff, and combined monthly/annual appraisals for procurement personnel, all designed to empower continuous employee development.

Through the establishment of the "Striving Forward Incentive Fund", we have deeply aligned core team performance with critical indicators such as store operational efficiency and innovation project implementation. This approach effectively drives the decomposition and execution of strategic objectives, creating an integrated performance management system across all levels. During the reporting period, we collaborated with multiple departments to upgrade the performance program, closely aligning with strategic development needs. We optimized short- and medium-term incentive mechanisms for businesses including membership stores and private labels. Additionally, we implemented innovative incentive systems for business segments such as local development, investment promotion, and merchandising, along with project-based incentives like the "Campaign Bonus" program, achieving the dual objectives of corporate cost optimization and employee income growth.



#### **Allocation Criteria**

• The total bonus pool is established upon achieving phased profit targets during the fiscal year. Following board approval, incentives are distributed based on the annual KPI growth rates of evaluated personnel.

#### **Distribution Principles**

We place paramount importance on employee learning and growth, providing diverse training and development opportunities to enable continuous workplace advancement and value realization, ultimately achieving mutual growth for both employees and the enterprise. Our digital learning platform "RT-Mart Academy" addresses historical challenges including data inaccuracies, integration difficulties, complex training processes, and limited application scenarios, establishing unified training system management that enhances our lifecycle training governance while reducing costs and improving outcomes. During the reporting period, we dynamically updated online course content and optimized presentation formats in response to evolving business requirements.

We consider employee development the core driver of corporate progress, having built a comprehensive career-cycle talent cultivation system. Leveraging the intelligent "RT-Mart Academy" platform with its smart learning path matching and real-time progress tracking capabilities, we effectively resolve traditional pain points like data silos and fragmented management, achieving centralized training resource allocation and visualized talent development oversight. During the reporting period, we further refined the curriculum architecture and delivery methods to continuously enhance learning experiences and effectiveness.

We continuously develop and optimize targeted training programs for critical positions based on operational needs, including "Fresh Food Technician Training", "Logistics Store-Warehouse System Training", "Corporate Culture Training", and "Management Trainee Programs". Additionally, we conduct professional training sessions to address emerging skill requirements as our business evolves.

#### Online **Learning Zone**

We have established an online learning zone to significantly improve the efficiency of content search and learning. The zone includes: "Corporate Culture Section", "Integrity Section", "Trainer Section", and "Store Operations Section".

#### Learning **Content Review** and Update

We conducted a comprehensive review of professional courseware and various learning materials online, removing outdated content and updating with new materials that better align with business needs.

#### Expanded **Employee** Coverage

We extended the service from originally supporting only full-time employees to now offering comprehensive online learning for all staff (including full-time employees, temporary employees, and labordispatched employees ).

#### Xinli Program



Through our strategic Xinli Program talent pipeline initiative, we identify high-potential candidates across omnichannel business units and our Xinhai management trainee pool. This customized leadership development and professional competency enhancement program serves as an executive talent incubator. During the reporting period, we completed 2 Xinli training cycles, developing 21 department manager-level and 63 divisional supervisors-level trainees, thereby strengthening our strategic talent pipeline.





#### **Customer Service Training**



We have established an omnichannel customer service competency matrix, developing a micro-course system through our intelligent learning platform. This includes standardized courses such as online "5-Minute Micro-Courses" and offline "High-Potential CSR Advancement Programs", covering service etiquette, consumer protection regulations, and particularly emphasizing core competencies like complaint resolution and emergency response. During the reporting period, we achieved 100% training coverage across all customer service teams.

#### **Carrier Training Initiatives**



In East China region, we host monthly carrier coordination meetings to review KPI performance, operational metrics, scoring details, and collaboratively develop improvement plans.

Our Jinan fresh produce warehouse in North China region has implemented an innovative monthly evaluation system for supplier performance assessment. The facility also conducts biannual stratified training covering logistics operations and safety compliance for suppliers, drivers, and loading personnel.

South China region has established a bimonthly training platform reaching 50+ core suppliers per session, featuring standardized warehouse induction courses and peak-season capacity planning mechanisms. Prior to major sales seasons, we convene all carriers for operational preparedness meetings to ensure fulfillment capability.

### **Train-the-Trainer Program**

We have implemented a certified internal trainer accreditation and advancement system as the cornerstone of organizational capability building. Our Talent Development Center annually initiates trainer cultivation programs, evaluating instructors' professional competencies and role fitness through scenario-based assessments. The reporting period saw completion of our training material system overhaul, which deeply integrates master-apprentice knowledge transfer mechanisms with standardized curriculum development, creating a virtuous cycle of knowledge preservation and skill advancement to continuously strengthen our talent development foundation.

In February 2025, we conducted nationwide trainer certification and promotions according to the Internal Trainer Management Guidelines, with all instructor rating certifications scheduled for completion by mid-March.

# Fostering a Culture of Care

At Sun Art Retail, we deeply integrate the "people-oriented" philosophy into our ESG governance framework. Through diverse communication channels such as employee assemblies and satisfaction surveys, we continuously strengthen emotional connections and enhance organizational cohesion. Simultaneously, we consistently upgrade our occupational health and safety system by introducing psychological support hotlines and regular emergency drills, establishing dual safeguards for both physical and mental well-being. This reflects our unwavering commitment to employee welfare.

## **Employee Communication and Care**

We have established employee labor unions to safeguard workers' freedom of association and collective bargaining rights, providing reliable and accessible communication channels. In daily operations, we invite representatives from both sides to jointly discuss and determine the structure and functions of the unions, ensuring transparency in communication and the protection of workers' rights. As of the end of the reporting period, 76.25% of our employees were represented by independent unions or covered under collective bargaining agreements.

The unions actively monitor employees' family circumstances, offering special care and financial assistance to those facing hardships, helping them overcome urgent challenges. Additionally, the unions provide support such as hospital visit allowances, bereavement compensation, and congratulatory gifts for weddings and childbirths, further demonstrating our commitment to employee well-being.

We provide a range of communication channels, including regular staff meetings, employee forums, and complaint mailboxes, to enable workers to voice their opinions and suggestions, thereby helping our Group stay informed about their needs and provide timely assistance and feedback. In handling complaints and reports, we have clear policies requiring personnel responsible for collecting and processing complaints to never disclose complainants' personal information in any form. Additionally, we strictly prohibit retaliation against whistleblowers, with violators facing severe penalties, including potential legal action in serious cases.

Our Group places great emphasis on employee mental health by continuously offering psychological support services and regularly organizing open dialogues to encourage employees to seek professional counseling when needed. During the reporting period, we introduced a dedicated counseling hotline for senior management, further strengthening our mental health support system.

#### **Cornerstone Surveys**

We conduct regular "Cornerstone Surveys" to measure employee satisfaction and engagement, fostering two-way communication between the company and its workforce. These surveys help us gain deeper insights into employee challenges and concerns while enabling prompt follow-up actions. Beyond detailed questionnaires, we also conduct extensive one-onone interviews, including executive discussions, middlemanagement roundtables, and frontline staff surveys, ensuring representation across all job levels. By integrating satisfaction surveys with newly added organizational diagnostic tools, we assess employee sentiment across six key dimensions. During the reporting period, our overall employee satisfaction score reached 4.33 out of 5, while managerial satisfaction averaged 4.53, reflecting year-on-year improvements.



## **Employee Health and Safety**

We at Sun Art Retail strictly comply with relevant laws and regulations including the *Work Safety Law of the People's Republic of China* and the *Law of the People's Republic of China on the Prevention and Control of Occupational Diseases*. We have established and continuously improved our safety training system and management protocols, dedicated to enhancing all employees' safety awareness and their capabilities in accident prevention and emergency response. During the reporting period, the Group recorded three work-related fatal accidents among employees.

Guided by our safety objectives of "Safety First, Zero Violations, Zero Hazards, Zero Accidents", we consistently refine and update our internal rules and regulations. In daily production and operational activities, we conduct regular workplace safety risk assessments and strengthen supervision and inspection of safety regulation compliance and potential hazards. We are progressively advancing the revision and enhancement of our public safety inspection database, categorizing inspection items into three levels, critical, major, and general, to guide operations managers in implementing precise controls for high-risk matters.

Furthermore, we have optimized and upgraded all workplaces to safeguard employee health and safety. These improvements include installing eye-protective lighting systems and adding greenery, among other measures, to protect employees' physical and mental well-being and prevent potential occupational disease risks.

## **Safety Training**

We conduct regular safety education and training for risk-related positions, complemented by comprehensive safety knowledge assessments. We ensure all employees fully understand job-specific safety requirements, establishing a systematic and targeted occupational safety training system



#### **Safety Education & Training**

We conduct annual safety training for nationwide store employees through both online and offline channels, covering topics such as safety belt usage standards and elevated work procedures, effectively reducing safety risks and minimizing workplace accidents.



#### **Fire Safety Training**

We implement biannual fire safety training for all employees and delivery riders, combining theoretical knowledge with practical drills to ensure mastery of fire extinguishing and crowd evacuation skills.



#### **Anti-Terror & Emergency Drills**

We organize semi-annual antiterrorism and emergency response drills with 100% employee participation.

Leveraging our well-established fire safety management system and regular training mechanism, we have secured "Advanced Fire Safety Unit" awards for 9 stores, "Fire Safety Individual Excellence" honors for 4 employees, and a "Five-Star Fire Safety Management Unit" certification for 1 store as of the reporting period's end.

For logistics, warehousing and delivery personnel, we conduct regular job-specific safety training tailored to regional operational requirements.



#### Workplace Safety & Health Training

During the reporting period, we launched occupational health and safety courses on our online training platform "RT-Mart Academy". These courses cover workplace health protection, office safety essentials, emergency response and rescue, helping employees understand the importance of workplace health and safety while enhancing their awareness.

Additionally, we have established a safety incentive program to reward compliance with safety regulations, motivating employees to actively participate. Our improved monitoring mechanism ensures timely identification and correction of violations for effective safety policy implementation.

#### RT-Mart imes Kindness 100 Rural Quality Education Initiative

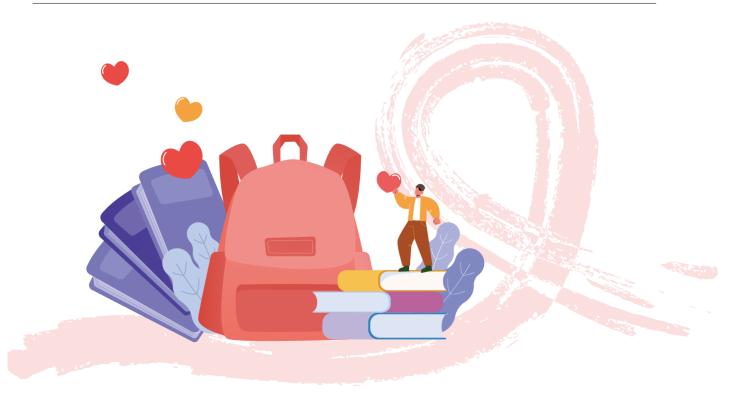

#### RT-Mart × Whisper "I Am a Girl" Rural School Restroom Renovation Project



Since 2019, Whisper has partnered with the China Foundation to annually upgrade restroom facilities in 10 rural schools, ensuring clean and private sanitation for students. In August 2024, Whisper joined forces with RT-Mart to relaunch this initiative, addressing girls' developmental needs and empowering their confident growth. During the reporting period, the school restroom renovation project was officially completed at Yanji School in Yilan Town, Yanji City, delivering vividly designed facilities that significantly improve sanitary conditions for rural children.
